Regulations on Lenten Fasting and Abstinence

The universal law of the Church concerning fasting and abstinence binds members of the Roman Catholic Church to these acts of penitence:

All persons over 14 years of age are to observe complete abstinence from meat on **Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and the Fridays of Lent.** All persons over 18 years of age and under 59 years of age are to observe **Ash Wednesday and Good Friday** as days of Fasting. Fasting allows one full meal during the day with two additional smaller meals sufficient to maintain health.

Persons between the ages of 18 and 59 are encouraged to take on additional acts of fasting and abstinence during this Lenten season as their health and their responsibilities allow.

Note: Drinking of ordinary liquids does not break the fast. Abstinence precludes the use of meats, but not eggs or the condiments made from meat products.

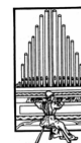

A Note on Today's Hymn

Number 794: Ye Watchers and Ye Holy Ones

The word "Alleluia" (Praise the Lord) is the epitome of praise in church language, but medieval custom (still preserved in many churches today) forbade the use of the word during Lent. So we sing this hymn is today as a "farewell to Alleluia." As late as the 15th century there was a ceremony of burying "Alleluia" in a coffin on Ash Wednesday, with the word to be revived and sung again on Easter day.

The festive hymn "Ye Watchers and Ye Holy Ones" is sung to the German tune LASST UNS ERFREUEN (Let us rejoice). The first stanza names the nine orders of angels who praise God. The "bearer of the eternal Word" in stanza 2 is the Virgin Mary. Stanza three adds in all the "souls in endless rest" who have arrived in heaven, and finally, in stanza 4 we are urged to join our voices in "supernal anthems" to the Holy Trinity. Therefore no one is exempt from singing!

NEW ALTAR SERVER TRAINING



The Church teaches us that the Mass is the greatest prayer of the Catholic community. God's people gather together at the liturgy to hear and reflect upon God's Word, to be fed by the Eucharist, and to be sent forth to live as disciples of Jesus. Everyone has a part in this prayerful celebration.

One of the special ways our Catholic children are traditionally invited to participate in the Mass is through service as an altar server. This ministry allows our young people to have a very active role in the Mass. Our children are invited to begin serving when they are strong enough to handle the book of prayers and carry the candles, usually in the fourth or fifth grade.

Servers commit themselves to weekly attendance at Mass, to training, and to faithful service whenever they are scheduled. They should be available to serve **at least 2 of the 3** scheduled Mass times on a rotating basis.

Training for new altar servers will be on Saturday, February 28, 2009 from 10:00 a.m. to 12 noon in the church. Register through the **Altar Server** page on our website: www.lasalette-church.org or by completing the form and returning it to the parish offices by **Monday, February 23rd**.

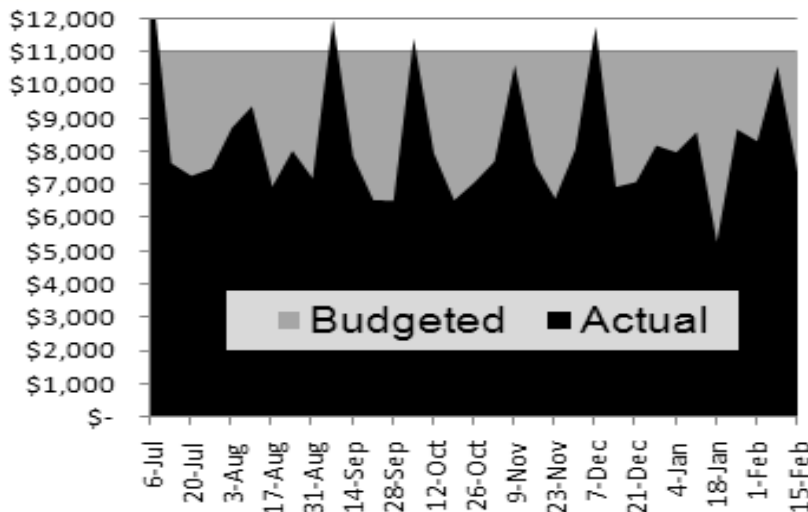
